## What we did this week:

This week the children have all enjoyed their UOI activities! They were all excited about a surprise visit from a real-life cow (Ms. Maricor in fancy dress!) who came to tell them all about herself and her friends from the farm!

In English, the children enjoyed watching a short film about the sounds that farm animals make and played along, imitating them.

The children created fluffy sheep using cotton wool balls. We also made muddy pig pictures using brown paint and our fingers! The children loved exploring the feeling of the paint on their hands.



In Chinese, the children have been reading about the cat who went fishing. They created paper plate cat faces and counted their whiskers; they look very cute!



The children also used printing techniques to create a fish bowl and fish. They then carefully counted 5 fish into the bowl!

You can help by talking to your children at home, in their main language, about the different animals we learn about, what they eat, what they sound like and where they live.
